JOB DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The summer missionary is a full-time, temporary position on one of OBHC's four campuses. This job is a full-time position throughout the summer and will require work outside of the typical 8 am – 5 pm office schedule. Periods of leave (specific evenings and/or days) must be discussed with and approved by campus administration.

Oklahoma Baptist Homes for Children offers housing and food for summer missionaries, as well as limited compensation. All campus outings and activities that a summer missionary attends as part of this position will be paid for by OBHC.

This position is classified as *safety-sensitive* under the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act due to its duties involving vehicle and equipment operation and direct patient or child care, and is therefore exempt from the Act's anti-discrimination provisions.

Dates: This position exists during the summer months. Although exact dates vary those dates are generally in late May/early June, July & August. Once an application is received, the campus will inform the applicant of exact dates of employment.

Location: One of the four OBHC campuses**: *Boys Ranch Town (BRT), Edmond; Baptist Home for Girls, Madill; Baptist Children's Home, Owasso; The Vine, South OKC*
